Hand delivered entries received on the first day, will be classed as arriving on the second day and picked out at random. The schedule will be available on-line to view from Wednesday 27th March 2024, with entry forms available from Wednesday 10th April 2024 at 10am. Any entries received with **no payment**, will only be processed once payment has been received. If a payment cheque for entries is returned from the bank, the Society will charge a fee of £25.

TOCYNNAU A PHASIAU · TICKETS AND PASSES

Immediately, upon receipt of tickets and passes, exhibitors are requested to check that the allocation is correct. No duplicate tickets or passes will be issued during the Show period free of charge.

i) Exhibitor refunds and declaration of non-attendance Refunds in exceptional circumstances.

The Society will only issue a refund after 19 June 2024 in extreme exceptional circumstances, such as government restrictions, serious illness or death. Any such refund would be subject to all tickets and passes being returned to the Livestock Office no later than 14 July 2024, with a receipt as proof of return. Those who post their tickets must do so by recorded delivery, with the proof of postage retained.

Any exhibitor who is unable to attend the event **must** inform the Society in writing by 19 June 2024, a partial refund will then be issued. After this date, although no refund will be issued, exhibitors must still inform the Livestock Office of their absence in writing. Any tickets and passes received must be returned, unused, directly to the Livestock Office by 14 July 2024, with a receipt as proof of return.

Failure by any exhibitor to notify the Society of their absence in writing and return any tickets or passes received may result in action being taken against that exhibitor. Under the terms of the Society's Disciplinary Procedure, any exhibitor who is found to have breached the Society's rules may be barred from exhibiting at future shows for a period of time.

ii) If unable to compete during the event, due to animal injury.

Any exhibitor whose animal becomes injured whilst on the Showground and is unable to compete in its class, must be certified by one of the Society's vets. The Vets certificate MUST then be supplied to the Livestock Office. Failure to adhere to these procedures may result in disciplinary action being taken as per above.

ALL CARAVANS WILL BE ALLOCATED ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVED BASIS.

NO PLOTS WILL BE HELD FOR A SPECIFIC SECTION.

Exhibitors please be aware that due to demand, not all requests may be accommodated, but alternatives will be offered in this instance. Also, it will not be possible for all caravan plots to have an electrical hook-up, but exhibitors will be informed of this and refunded £60 prior to the Show. Please stipulate if you do not wish to have an electrical hook-up, and you may be accommodated in the North 12 caravan park at £110 per plot. Please note that a camper van is considered the same as a caravan by the Society and, therefore, a caravan pass should be ordered if you intend to bring a camper van to the Show.

There will be additional caravan spaces at Wernfawr, which can accommodate livestock exhibitors and vehicle passes will allow access on site to attend to livestock, but entry will be prohibited after 8am.

With Health and Safety/Fire Regulations having to be rigorously administered, exhibitors **MUST** state on their entry form if their vehicle will be used for accommodation during the Show. There will not be a fee for exhibitors using their vehicles for accommodation. Exhibitors are restricted to **ONE CARAVAN** plot **ONLY PER ADDRESS.** Exhibitors entering carcasses only are not permitted to book a caravan plot. Exhibitors requiring caravan plots are requested to submit their entries in good time as these are very limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

To ensure compliance with Fire Safety Regulations, all caravans will be required to be spaced six metres between caravan walls and three metres clear between associated equipment (e.g., Car or awning) and the adjacent caravan. All caravans and other vehicles used for accommodation MUST carry a suitable fire extinguisher (5-kilo dry powder type). Horse Exhibitors only – A caravan will not be admitted onto the Livestock Hill if it is being towed by a lorry.

Children are always the responsibility of parents and carers whilst on the Showground including the caravan and camping parks. Unaccompanied children under the age of 12 are not admitted to the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society show's and must not be left unaccompanied in a caravan or tent.

While accompanied children are welcome in most caravanning and camping areas at the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society shows the livestock caravan park and camping area (Exhibitors) is not suitable for children under 16.

All vehicles will be inspected upon arrival.

· CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

Cancellation of Classes

As per our Rules & Regulations Rule 12

- a) The Board of Directors reserves the right to cancel or transfer any section or class if they deem there to be insufficient entries. In the event of any class or section being cancelled entrants therein will be notified as soon as possible by email, after the closing date of entries and their fees will be returned.
- **b)** If, at the discretion of the RWAS Society, two or more Dairy breeds are amalgamated owing to insufficient entries, a Champion in each individual breed will be chosen.
- c) The RWAS Society reserves the right, at their discretion, to amalgamate classes, as appropriate, which they deem to have insufficient entries.

TICKET ENTITLEMENT

Exhibitor ticket entitlement for the HORSE section: -

Horse exhibitors will receive one more ticket than horses entered on any day, up to a maximum of five tickets per day. For example, an exhibitor with two horses, one showing on Monday and one showing on Tuesday, will receive four one day tickets: two tickets for the horse shown on the Monday and two tickets for the horse shown on the Tuesday.

Additional adult one-day tickets may be purchased at £32.00 (including VAT) each and additional child one-day tickets may be purchased at £5.00 (including VAT).

IDENTIFICATION OF PIGS MOVED OFF A HOLDING

Identification requirements for the movement of pigs to a show or exhibition.

 No person may move a pig off a holding; (a)To a show or exhibition; Unless it is marked in accordance with article 7, or with a herdmark that included a unique individual identification number.

Identification of pigs ARTICLE 7

 7.(1) No person may move a pig off a holding unless it has; (a) An ear tag with the letters "UK" followed by the herdmark of the holding from which the pig is moved off; Or (b) A tattoo showing that herdmark (with or without the letters "UK")

All prize money will be the responsibility of the owed competitor to claim. The process of claiming prize money will be via your RWAS account. There will be no pen restriction for exhibitors this year. However, if pens are oversubscribed the Society will reduce exhibitors' pen allocations accordingly. Exhibitors will be informed of this decision as soon as possible. Exhibitors are NOT permitted to book tack pens at the Show; the Society will allow exhibitors to utilise any spare pens to accommodate their tack at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

AMODAU - CONDITIONS

NATWEST Pig Boards ONLY, are to be used whilst in the ring.

- 1. Pigs to have been registered in a published volume or accepted for entry in a forthcoming volume of the BPA's Herd Book or the BLPS herd book as appropriate. (It is not sufficient for an animal to be eligible for registration). Animals registered in a Grading Register of a Herd book are not eligible for entry in these classes. The ear number, registered name, Herd Book number and date of birth of each pig, also, must be supplied for printing in the Official Catalogue together with the name of the breeder in cases where the exhibitor is not also the breeder.
- 2. At all Shows in 2024, female pigs (all breeds) born before 1 January 2023 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show they have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks of age, a birth notified litter of pigs.
- 3. At all Shows in 2024, female pigs born on or after 1 January and before 1 July in the year before the Show must within 18 months of their date of birth have farrowed, suckled and reared to four weeks old a birth notified litter of pigs.
- 4. Boars of two years of age and over, (all breeds) are to be certified as having sired at least three live litters within the twelve months preceding the first day of the Show. The pigs comprising such litters are to have been litter notified in the BPA's Herd Book or proof of their birth must have been given to the Association.
- 5. Boars aged twelve months or more at the time of exhibition must have their tusks cut prior to the Show.
- 6. ALL BOARS must be shown by TWO COMPETENT ADULT HANDLERS who are equipped with protective boards.

^{**}Class times may change at relatively short notice, in periods of very hot weather.

7. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited (white woodflour is permitted).

S.1303 CYSTADLEUAETH MOCHYN IFANC Y FLWYDDYN Y BPA BPA JUNIOR PIG OF THE YEAR

BPA YOUNG PIG OF THE YEAR COMPETITION 2024 – The highest placed junior pig owned by a member of the British Pig Association will qualify for the BPA Pig of the Year Competition, with the final to be held at The Royal Three Counties Showground as part of the Malvern Autumn Show 27 - 29 September 2024.

A condition of entering the competition is that prize winners at preliminary rounds must intend to exhibit at the Final. Any pig not forward will need to be reviewed by a panel of three individuals, and a monetary fine may be applied should the panel not feel the reason justified. £25 first offence, increased for repeat offences or withdrawals. This could also lead to a ban from this competition.

The award is open to all breeds of pedigree pigs entered at the Show. The object is to determine the best young pig born in the year of the show as an example of their respective breeds. Aside from being the property of a member of the BPA, the pigs must also be litter notified and registered in BPA's herd books or the herd book of the British Lop Society.

To be eligible for a qualifying round a pig (male or female) must be born after 1st January of the year of the Show. A pig judged Best Young Male or Best Young Female in a qualifying round cannot compete in any subsequent round. If a pig having qualified at an earlier show again qualifies at a later show the judge for that breed shall select an alternative pig of the same breed and sex from any class covering the required age group. At each qualifying round the judge will select the Best Young Male and Best Young Female.

The Best Young Male and Best Young Female from each of the qualifying rounds will enter the Final. Prizes for preliminary rounds will be a glass trophy for the best young pig of each sex.

Note: Rosettes only will be presented at each preliminary round. Glass trophies for preliminary rounds will be presented at the Final.

The Final will be to judge the Best Modern Young Male and Female with reserves and the Best Traditional Male and Female with reserves; the Best Young Pig (i.e., Young Pig of the Year) and Reserve.

In the Final the Modern and Traditional Male and Female Champions will each receive £60, Reserve Champions £30, Overall, Champion £200 and the Jack Howlett Memorial Trophy, and Reserve £150.

- a. BGS Monitored Herds A current certificate must be included with entries.
- b. All Other Goats Entries will be restricted to goats that are whole herd negative CAE tested within twelve months of the date of the show. BGS Regulation 26 (b) (i) defines "whole herd" for CAE testing purposes. No entries will be accepted unless CAE blood tests results are on BGS submission forms. This is to enable quick and accurate confirmation of the status of the goats attending the show. There will be a minimum two metre gap, between goats from a) and b). Scrapie Monitoring herd scheme will also be approved in the dairy goat section.

Exhibitors are advised that milk that has been passed through the communal weigh bucket should not be fed to kids, as this has been a factor in the spread of CAE in the past.

Exhibitors' must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation for Recording, Identification and Movement of goats in force at the time of the Show.
