



The Royal Welsh Spring Festival is a two-day event celebrating the best of family life, food, outdoor pursuits, and gardening along with Livestock and Equine competitions and a Premier Open Dog Show with an element of smallholding and vintage. We offer a good feel and spacious event for family or individuals and also welcome their pet dog so that all can enjoy a day out. Held on a well-developed showground, the Festival boasts an array of permanent buildings including a Craft, Art and Education Hall, Food Hall, Smallholder Centre, Gwledd Welsh Food & Drink area and dedicated livestock areas, and plenty of outdoor options.

With tarmac roadways, we can offer a selection of indoor, outdoor, hard standing and grass pitches. We are pleased to announce that the Royal Welsh Spring Festival will be re-branded with a new look marketing campaign with a targeted social media campaign in 2025 aimed at families or those wanting a day out in the country to enjoy food, open spaces and the best of country life and arena entertainment and workshop

Boasting on-site parking, easy access, friendly staff and a relaxed atmosphere, the Royal Welsh Spring Festival is the perfect day out for the entire family, regardless of the weather.

Display ring entertainment, live music, demonstrations and interactive activities enhance the livestock, and equine (including show jumping) competitions. The only Premier Open Dog Show in Wales is also staged over this two-day event with some classes qualifying for Crufts or bring your pooch to have a go at our fun dog show.

It is an ideal event to sell gardening items, small machinery implements, equine and canine related goods, anything smallholding related and to provide any diversification ideas such as caravanning, camping, glamping and outdoor pursuits or green solutions.

Different areas suitable for trade stands include:

Country life area - Contains our activity centered zone, interactive activities and competitions. Our aim is to promote outdoor living, pursuits and sports, many demonstrations will be organized to reflect this. This area is ideal for outdoor activity trade stands and stands not affected by possible adverse weather, such as hot tubs, glamping, sports related, glamping/caravans/motorhomes, as well as the Premier Open Dog Show and forestry related crafts are staged in the area with an element of watersports. Electric and water may be available.

The Foodhall / Gwledd - The dedicated Food Hall retailing the very best food and drink products, as well as the new Gwledd (Welsh Food Village) where visitors can sit at one of the many indoor or outdoor picnic benches to enjoy a selection of food and drinks which are produced, manufactured or processed primarily in Wales and the Border Counties. Livestock – The Festival attracts over 1400 livestock entries including Cattle, Sheep, Pigs & Goats. We have limited trade stand space available for agriculture and livestock related traders within the large livestock building. The Breed Society stands will also be situated in this section with live animals housed on the stands.

Wool zone - Located in the Meirion Shearing Centre which consists of the following: wool handling competitions and demonstrations, demonstrations of blade shearing, spinning and weaving. Vintage shearing equipment will be on display. This area is dedicated to anything related to wool, and its uses. Electric and Wi-Fi available on payment and request, clear space or 3m x 3m pods, there is also indoor space for wool related traders in Hall 1.

Hall 1 - Arts, Crafts, Education & Demonstrations, suitable for new and established vendors in modules in 3m x 3m and multiples thereof. Electric and free business Wi-Fi available. Within this Hall we will also be developing an educational theme for all ages with workshops on stands.

Smallholder Centre - Here you can find a café, trade stands and smallholder related sales, information, service and hospitality stands, electric and free business Wi-Fi available, water may be available 3m x 3m “pods”. Information and workshop activity will also be organized. The Glamorgan Smallholders workshops and honey section will be featured. Also to attract other Smallholder groups to attend. We established a tourism section in this area in 2023 which was well received as well as a equine auction and antiques Centre.

Outdoor spaces - ideal for machinery, outdoor clothing, horse and livestock related products, farming sundries, equipment etc., all services may be available depending on location. A vintage machinery display presence will also be arranged.

Gardening - The event is at the start of the summer season and visitors are keen to purchase items for their gardens, allotments, or patio areas. We will continue with the work started by Lantra and offer an opportunity for Welsh Growers to exhibit within our prestigious Welcome Centre and patio area. There will be opportunities for indoor and outdoor space.

Tourism & Diversification - Showcasing the best of diversification and tourism Wales has to offer, located in the Smallholders Centre we also offer pitches outside the Hall for Caravans, pods etc.
